Fan Wall Technology and Variable Frequency Drive Best Practices

This topic will describe multiple fan arrays used in air handlers to reduce energy consumption, air handler footprint, and sound transmission. Instead of providing a single large fan to move a large quantity of air, the fan array design uses a wall of small diameter direct drive fans to move the same quantity of air. Come see how you can use this technology in your next retrofit or new design. The fan array system uses a VFD to control the pressure and volume of air. Mr. Montesanto will also cover variable frequency drive implementation as it pertains to fanwalls and other multiple motor installations.

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A HISTORY OF ASHRAE RESEARCH

It is the research program that sets ASHRAE apart from other professional societies and association of its kind. ASHRAE's Handbook series, technical programs, standards, and special publications all utilize the results of Research.

An interest in research can be traced to the very roots of this Society. At the first annual meeting of the American Society of Refrigerating Engineers (ASRE), one of ASHRAE's predecessor societies, an initial order of business dealt with research. They passed a resolution recommending that the U.S. Department of Agriculture equip and maintain a cold storage plant for the purpose of research. They also appointed a committee of five members to work on the establishment of a standard unit or "ton" of refrigeration.

In a similar vein, ASHRAE's other forbearers, the American Society of Heating and Ventilation Engineers (ASHVE) recognized that "the practice of heating, ventilating and air-conditioning was more of an art than a science." In 1971, ASHVE took steps to correct this by initiating a Research Bureau. This facility was located in three rooms in the US Bureau of Mines Experiment Station in Pittsburgh, PA. Research was conducted here from 1919 until 1944.

From these humble beginnings to a current \$2 million annual budget and 70-80 research projects being conducted at once, ASHRAE Research has definitely come a long way in advancing the arts and sciences of HVAC&R.
